Having spent a fruitful year as Vice-President under David Gulliford's leadership, Gavin Kerr applied himself with great skill and vigour to the tasks that lay ahead in 2011. Perhaps the most frustrating of these was the directive from Probus Centre for the South Pacific (PCSP) that we modify our Club Constitution & Standing Orders and adopt a format laid down by Probus Central. To have done this in toto could have incurred serious member security risks, as PCSP was asking us to supply our members' names plus a lot of personal information so that it could establish a large database of all Probus clubs in the South Pacific region. A committee comprising Neville Cleary, Richard Whipp & Trevor Wallin was appointed to review the PCSP proposal and to see what, if any, of its proposals should be incorporated in our Constitution. The committee's recommendations will be forthcoming in 2012. In the meantime, **in accordance with the unanimous vote of our members, members' names only have been forwarded to PCSP for insurance purposes.**

The other major undertaking under Gavin's leadership has been the vigorous drive to increase our membership with special emphasis on the recruitment of younger men. Enthusiastically driven by Ray Stallworthy, this endeavour has seen seven "youngsters" added to our ranks ... Michael Ledbury, Harry Watson, Raymond Cosgrove, Michael Calloway, Ronald Barratt, Bruce Williams & John Patterson. Listening to each of their initial speeches briefly recounting their life stories, one has to marvel at the breadth & depth & richness of their accomplishments. What a trove of talent we are amassing at Seaforth Probus ... may it continue !!!

Of course our drive for more members is imperative, given that the average age of current members is around eighty years. Added to this is the issue of resignations with four this year ... Terry McKay, Don Menzies, Harry Hooley & Graham Chalkley, the movement of Doug Law & Doug Forsyth from full membership to the ranks of TMS ... and the deaths of Geoffrey Cotton & Ian Venn-Brown, two men whose contribution to Seaforth Probus was considerable and whose loss was deeply felt by us all.

Just how precious is our health and how we take it for granted. The past twelve months have born witness to the mortal coil we share. Rick Clapp, Phil Thompson, Noel Hars, Reg Whitely, Peggy Mitchell, Neville & Norrie Cleary, Robyn & Warren Ogborne, Don Elliott, Lee Murrell ... all confronted by potentially serious health problems ... and Elise Carr, increasingly disabled by her Parkinson's Disease and requiring more constant care from her devoted husband Kevin. As was stated by a former President ... "how important our belonging to Seaforth Probus Club is to our health and happiness...the respect and esteem of our fellow Probians, the intellectual stimulation and fellowship we enjoy and the many wonderful adventures we share ... for each of us Probus has surely become an important part of our extended family."

The extended family we share through probus speaks to us eloquently through our monthly newsletter ... and what a newsletter it is!! Applying his years of experience in the printing industry, Ray Isaacs has produced a document of real quality, building on the pioneering editorship of Allan & Ella Dautreband.

In addition to our monthly newsletter we now receive a Probus Diary as a progressive update of current & proposed activities projected forward for six months. This is emailed out to members on A4 format ... very handy for securing with a "fridge magnet" for ready reference by the "head of the house" when planning one's social programme. And Nicholas Guoth maintains an up to date membership list complete with name, address, phone & email numbers, that he emails to members periodically...but he has to rely on members to keep him up to date with changes in their circumstances.

Attendances at club meetings have been up & down and there has been a serious problem with the audiovisual equipment at the Bowling Club ... so much so that several guest speakers have been unable to use their prepared visual material. After repeated endeavours to rectify the problem, it was discovered that the personnel responsible for the installation left the wrong instructions with the club management. Ian Smith provided us with a stimulating array of guest speakers, none more memorable than Dr. Jennifer Wong whose presentation entitled "Stem Cell Research" was the highlight of the year. As Warren Ogborne remarked when thanking her ... "gentlemen, you have just been privileged to look into the future."

The golfers enjoyed three notable events ... a delightful Getaway at Wiseman's Ferry at the Australis Resort where Helen & David Gulliford shared the honours, the contest with Manly Probus for the David Millard Trophy which we lost 18.4 to 17.8 and our Getaway at Mollymook where Ian & Meg Stevenson excelled themselves...especially Meg who carried off a handful of golf balls.

And the bowlers, under the guidance of Lee Murrell, had a great year...starting with a three way tie between Arthur Buchan, Neville Cleary & "BYB" Mitchell. As the year progressed the top scorers wilted under Lee's stringent handicapping (free of bias) with success coming to Bruce Cormack, Dick Higgins (his first win in five years) Lee Murrell & Judy Parker sharing a win and Terry Osborne cleaning up in our final contest for the year. In September we lost to Manly Probus on the overall point score despite winning three of the five matches. We celebrated year's end pre-Christmas with our traditional sumptuous luncheon courtesy Neville & Norrie Cleary and our lady bowlers...and following our defeat by Manly Probus, the same ladies sat us down to a delicious morning tea.

During the year several of our number were indisposed including Neville & Norrie Cleary and Elaine Daly, while Tom Stee & Bruce Cormack were briefly absent overseas. And we spent a few months worrying about Lee Murrell's health. Thankfully, after quite intensive investigation by the medical experts, his malady was diagnosed & appropriate treatment instituted. It's great to see him once again enjoying good health and enjoying his customary sharp form on the green.

Our stalwart bowler, John Daly, a Foundation Member of the Club, organised a luncheon at Wakehurst Golf Club during the year for the seven Foundation Members still among us. According to George Mitchell it was a great celebration and he hopes to be present at a similar event next year.

Gavin's presidential year has been a good one for outings and one of the novel features has been the change of pick-up venue. Instead of boarding our coach at Seaforth shops and struggling to find suitable parking for our cars, we now drive to Seaforth Bowling Club to be collected. The club has kindly given us permission to park our cars there and collect them on our return.

The other issue of importance concerning travel was David Gulliford's fact find questionnaire. This revealed that few members now wish to travel overseas with or without Probus. There was however, enthusiasm for local trips, our daylong Discovery Tours & our Golf - Bowls Getaways. *But one overseas trip was a winner ... Viet Nam & Cambodia ... and who's surprised. The sights in both countries are breathtaking and the people delightful.*

Reg Green's Discovery Day outings have provided us with a galaxy of fascinating experiences ... the tour of the spectacular State Theatre & its amazing history, High Tea at the Carrington Hotel at Katoomba & the Norman Lindsay Gallery at Falconbridge, the Garvin Research Institute & our walk along the Kakoda Memorial Trail, the Windsor Heritage Tour & Farmgate Trail, Ebenezer and a tour of Vaucluse house, the former home of William Charles Wentworth, to mention just a few. Reg's interest in Australian history & the wonders in the world around us are a guarantee of future wonderful Discovery Day Tours in the years ahead.

When Trevor Wallin agreed to coordinate our cultural programme he is said to have balked at the prospect ... "not being a culture vulture." Well, he's certainly done us proud in 2011 with plays at the Glen Street Theatre, Mary Poppins at the Capitol Theatre and the sensational concert by the Brandenburg Orchestra at the City Recital Hall featuring the renown fortepianist, Kristian Bezuidenhout ... (see newspaper critique) ... Trevor has already booked us for a second concert with the Brandenburg Orchestra in 2012 featuring the music of Mozart & Mendelssohn, two of the world's greatest musical prodigies. If this was not enough, our "culture vulture" secured seats for ten of us to attend the Australian Opera's wonderful presentation of Verdi's "La Traviata" at Mrs. Macquarie's Point on Sydney Harbour. The night was fine, the scene was spectacular, the orchestra was superb and the performers magnificent. A once in a lifetime experience !!

Neville & Norrie Cleary, despite ill health, staged two enjoyable Getaways during the year ... the first at Wiseman's Ferry at the Australis Resort where we enjoyed beautiful scenery, golf beside the river, lunch at the Settlers' Inn at St. Albans and the delight of sheer relaxation. Our second Getaway took us to Mollymook with excellent accommodation and superb cuisine ... (Nev insisted on "quality, not quantity") ... and our travels took us to Mogo Zoo followed by lunch at Isidores Resturant, the usual golf & bowls, a tour of Milton arranged by the Milton Historical Society, meals at the Bomaderry, Milton & Mollymook Bowling Clubs and a cruise by power boat on Jervis Bay among the dolphins en route to Point Perpendicular followed by lunch at the Huskisson RSL.

The magic of Mozart

A FEW seasons back the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra acquired a fortepiano and this enabled them to move from the baroque to classical era with greater ease.

In their latest concert series they have taken full advantage of this flexibility with an all-Mozart program starring perhaps the most exciting fortepianist of today.

Kristian Bezuidenhout first appeared with the ABO in 2007, shortly after the orchestra acquired its fortepiano which is a copy of Mozart's own instrument.

For this concert the main piece was the E flat major concerto No.22. The first movement ended with a particularly brilliant cadenza of his own making.

Guest conductor and first fiddle player, Canadian Marc Destrube,

who has appeared with the ABO on several occasions, had a quiet evening on the fiddle – the only time we heard him was in the lovely string quartet accompaniment in parts of the concerto's slow movement.

But his qualities as a conductor and leader were evident throughout the program.
