- May** **Bradleys Head Walk.** - We meet at Taronga Park Zoo main entrance on Bradleys Head Rd via Mosman Junction. We will walk past the Athol Hall Café (not open Mondays) down to the HMAS Sydney memorial mast, one of the few places in Sydney where you can enjoy a million-dollar view for free. Then on, around and back up to the zoo entrance where there is a large courtyard with facilities and a café for our traditional coffee.
- June** **Ogilvy Rd to Clontarf Reserve.** - Meet at Clontarf parking area. Then one or two cars can take everyone to Ogilvy Rd from where we will walk along part of the Manly to Spit Bridge walking track back to Clonny's Kiosk for our traditional coffee.
- July** **Manly Dam.** - We will meet at 9.15 for 9.30 am at Manly Reservoir's first car park near the dam wall at the end of King St, off Condamine Street just south of St Kierans Church.
We will walk across the dam wall on the metal walkway followed by quite a steep climb to the top, then a mostly level bush track along the ridge to Kieran Street and retrace our steps back to the car park. About a one hour return trip up and back. Our traditional coffee will be upstairs inside Harvey Norman, entrance to parking from Roseberry Street.
- Aug.** **Manly Reservoir** - We will meet at 9.15 for 9.30 am at the Manly Reservoir Section 4 car park at the very end of Kings Street off Reservoir Section 4 car park at the very end of Kings Street off Condamine St just south of St Kierans Catholic Church. President Helen brought the meeting to a closure with a poem entitled "Probus Garden"



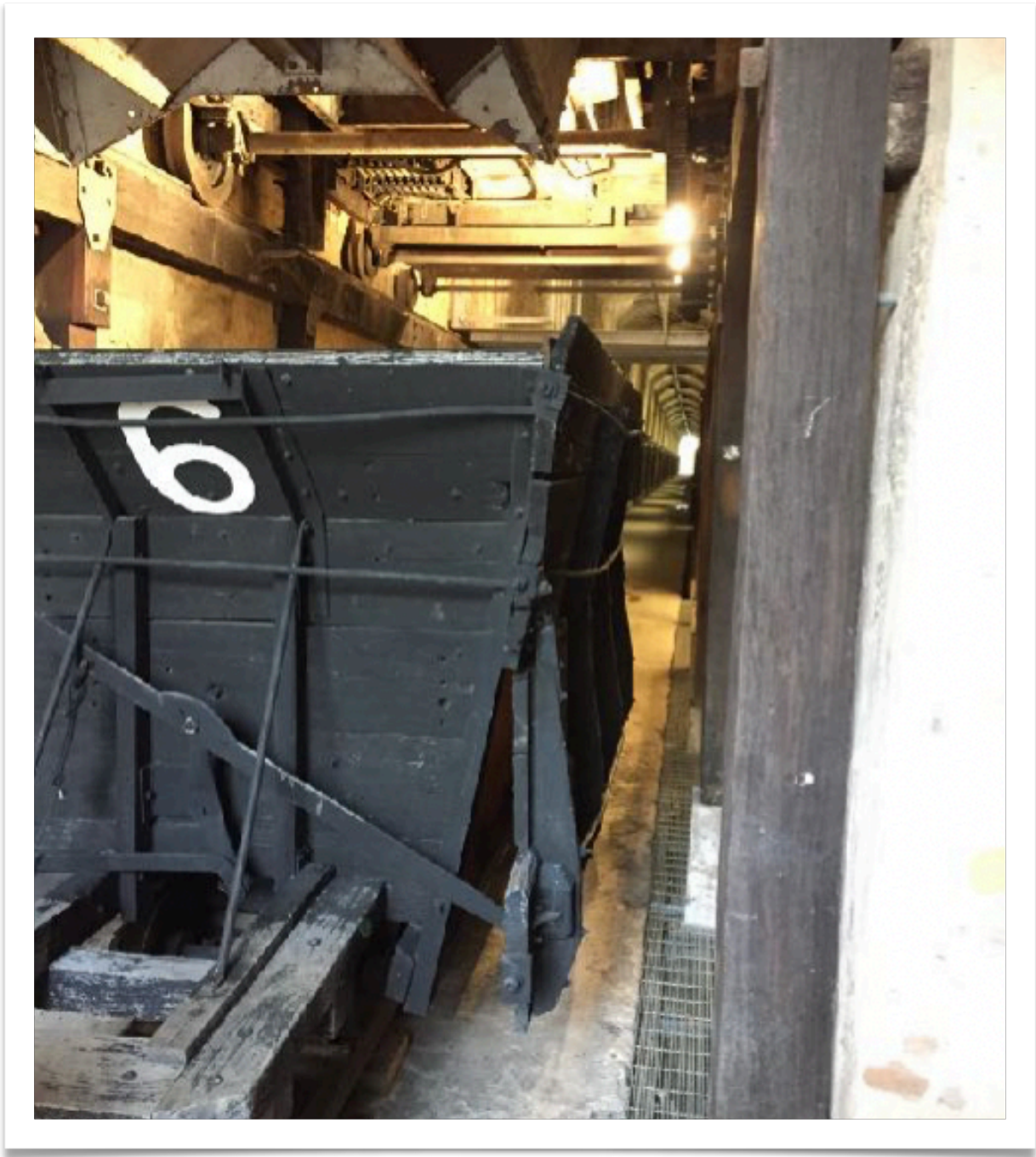

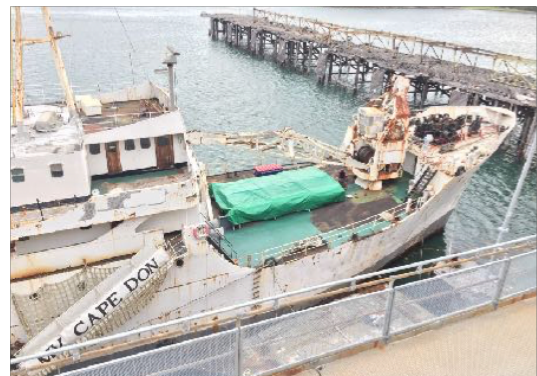
A most interesting historic facility in a first class location and restored in an eco-friendly way!

know existed!

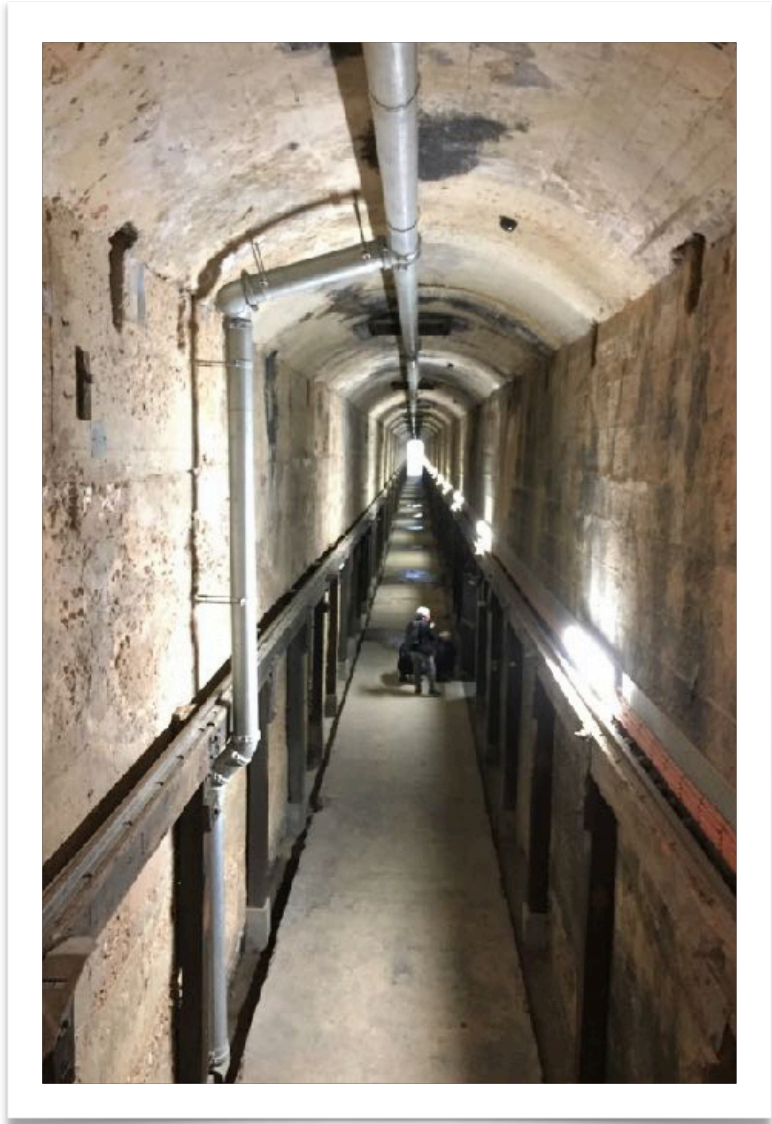
